What makes us human? Interdependence

Jeremy Vine has been conducting a series of interviews on Radio 2 with people he invites to consider, 'what makes us human?' His speakers have included, Ruby Wax, Terry Waite and Bill Oddie to mention a few. The responses have been varied and I would like to add my own. 'What makes us human' is living interdependent lives.



At the beginning of the bible in the story of creation we read that God created Adam but realised that it was not good for him to be alone, so he created Eve as his companion. As human beings God made us to live in community and not in isolation....to be interdependent.

I wonder how many of you remember times when our village communities were more integrated and less cliquey. Certainly that is how I remember life growing up in Poppleton during the 1970s. I recall community events in which large numbers of people were involved, such as the church trips to Butlins, Carol Singing, or Youth Group weekends away. Others, like the May Day celebrations on the village green and the sports clubs, went wider than the church. Underlying this was a greater sense of interdependence. We knew each other better, so were able to do things which were fun together, as well as caring for each other when needs arose that we could meet.

Today it seems that we lead far more independent lives. This can be for a number of reasons. People are more mobile in terms of where they live, so move around more readily. Forming community is then more difficult in this mobile culture. Our increased wealth means we can be more independent. Fear of rejection may cause us to live behind closed doors. Technological changes mean that we relate less and less to each other face to face and more in cyberspace. However, there can be an 'unreality' to this when we construct profiles of who we would like to portray on social media web sites.

The reality in being human is I believe that I need you and you need me. We were created to be interdependent and without this we become less human – our potential to be who we are created to be is diminished. So it is good to talk face to face, to laugh and cry together, to be community in all it's different forms. This makes us human!




Alne Oil Co-operative

Members, please note:

Orders for delivery before the Christmas/New Year break must be placed before 14th November. Any orders placed after this date will not be eligible for Syndicate terms and will be supplied at the standard market price.

Syndicate Members are enjoying low prices as they stock up on oil for the winter months ahead. In September, members took delivery of 87,600 litres of kerosene at a median price of 48.19p per litre compared with Boilerjuice 50.63p. This represents a saving across the Lower Swale Syndicate for the month of £1,900. (Plus 5% VAT on all prices.)

The Ministry of Gideons International

At the heart of the Gideon ministry is our love of God's Word as it is written down for us in the Bible and the belief in the power of His Word to bring people into a saving relationship with our Lord, Jesus Christ. So, we seek to witness to people and give them a copy of God's word, or if we can't personally present His Word to people, then we place copies of it in what we call the 'highways of life' so that they might find an opportunity to read it whenever the desire to do so arises. The most well known of these is probably hotels, but we also place them in hospitals, prisons, residential care homes and many other places where people might read it. We offer all Year 7 pupils a personal copy, with the aim that every young person in this nation (and indeed in 198 countries throughout the world!) might have the opportunity to read God's Word for themselves.

We know, sadly, to use the image from the parable of the sower, that some of this 'seed' will fall on the path, or stony ground, or on ground overcome by weeds, but we know too that much falls on good ground, and so often we hear both of the effect that a copy of God's Word has had on one person's life, and also of the wonderful harvest that has followed, as that person has witnessed to others.

Take, for example, Lee, who as a 15 year old child received his school testament and then proceeded to read it by night, by the light of the street lamp outside his bedroom, for fear of being discovered by his parents. It wasn't that they were particularly anti-God, but God just wasn't a part of their lives – there was no church in the city suburb where they lived, no Bible in the house, no history of Christianity in the family, so Lee thought he would be embarrassed if his parents discovered him reading his Bible. And he hid it after reading it. This pattern continued for two years, after which he was willing to accept an invitation from a friend to attend a church service --- and his story

continues to the present day when he is an ordained minister in Nottingham.
