I am sure we are all aware that Queen Elizabeth II has her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday this year. 21<sup>st</sup> April is her real birthday and this year 11<sup>th</sup> June is her official birthday, though there will be a number of significant events around this date to add to the celebrations. These include a party at Bishopthorpe Palace on 11<sup>th</sup> June and more locally, on June 12<sup>th</sup> the Alne Street Fayre is themed around the celebrations and there will be a Village Tea Party at Brafferton. Brafferton also have a dance on 25<sup>th</sup> June and a Flower Festival in St Peter's on the weekend of 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> July. I am sure there will be others.

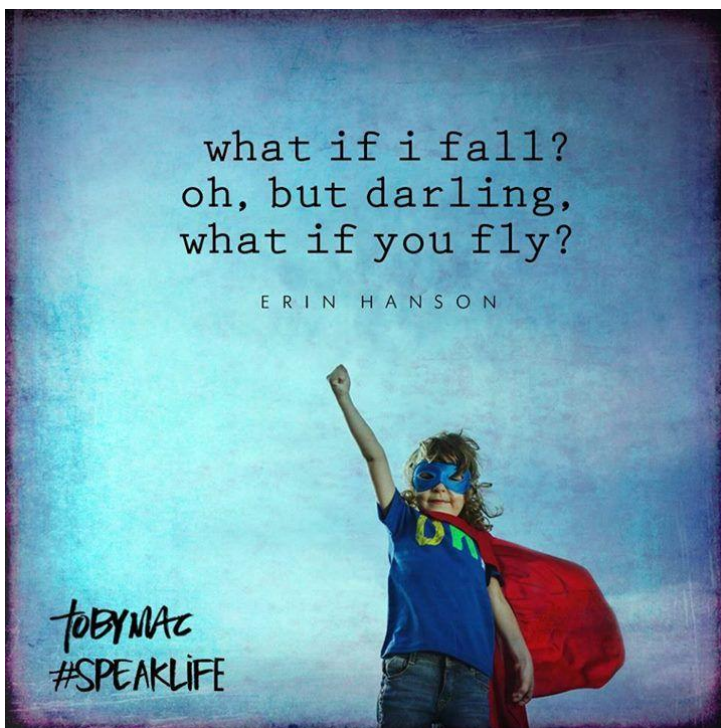
Queen Elizabeth is now our longest reigning monarch and has witnessed 12 prime ministers, beginning with Winston Churchill through to David Cameron. She is patron of over 600 charities and much to the delight of many, 'helped' in the James Bond scene for the opening of the 2012 Olympic Games in London.

She also has a very authentic Christian faith. The church will be making available booklets entitled 'The Servant Queen and the King she serves' to share something of the importance of her faith in Jesus. A larger booklet will be available in the churches for adults, and we hope to distribute a smaller child friendly version via primary schools.

When war broke out in 1939 she suggested to her father King George VI that he use the Minnie Louise Haskins verse for his Christmas Day broadcast – *'I said the man who stood at the Gate of the Year – "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied, "Go out into the darkness, and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way..."*

While she is our Servant Queen she knows the King she serves.

Soon the mother found a friend to talk to, and the boy slipped away.

At eight o'clock, the lights in the auditorium began to dim, the spotlights came on, and only then did they notice the boy - up on the piano bench, innocently picking out "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star." His mother gasped in shock and embarrassment but, before she could retrieve her son, the master himself appeared on the stage and quickly moved to the keyboard.

He whispered gently to the boy, "Don't quit. Keep playing." Leaning over, Paderewski reached down with his left hand and began filling in the bass part. Soon his right arm reached around the other side and improvised a delightful obligato. Together, the old master and the young novice held the crowd mesmerized with their blended and beautiful music.

In all our lives, we receive helping hands - some we notice, some we don't. Equally we ourselves have countless opportunities to provide helping hands - sometimes we would like our assistance to be noticed, sometimes we don't. Little of what we all achieve is without learning from others and without support from others and what we receive we should hand out.

In our recent celebration service, Bishop John commented on how his jaw hit the floor when he saw the amazing transformation of our church from the last time he had seen it. He also gave thanks to all our community for their helping hands and generosity. I know that the feedback we have had from our congregations and parishioners has really made it worthwhile, but I was so surprised when our new Facebook page "St Peter's Church Brafferton" started to get hits and likes from far and wide. ### **Alne Street Fayre – Sunday, 12<sup>th</sup> June**

A reminder that Alne Street Fayre takes place on **Sunday, 12<sup>th</sup> June**. Jack Hole, Church Wind, Mitchell Lane, Back Lane and Main Street (from the Village Hall to the X-roads) will all be closed to traffic from 08:00 to 18:00.
