# Harvest - A time to look upwards and outwards



Harvest Festivals have been a time when historically we have thanked God for providing us with food to eat – a time to look upwards to God. It has also been a time for us to look outwards, when we have sought to give to those less fortunate than we are – those who are not so sure when they will next eat.

Once again this year we will be inviting schools and the local community to bring along non-perishable food at our Harvest Festivals to support the work of the Salvation Army in York. (There is a notice in this month's magazine detailing the Harvest Celebrations this Autumn.)

One of the reflections I have had over this Summer is that 'fear causes us to look inwards, while love causes us to look outwards.' Fear causes us to hold on to our possessions, our relationships. Fear causes us to live with insecurity.

Fear causes us to be self-centred, and is the enemy of both love and faith.

Love on the other hand, causes us to look upwards in gratitude to God and outwards to those who need our help. Jesus once said that the summary of the law was; 'love God and love your neighbour.'

One of the more extra-ordinary stories of 'love' I came across this Summer, was from a Christian Youth Camp in Northern Ireland called 'Summer Madness.' Here a group of 2000 16-20 year olds were invited to raise or give money to support those helping the refugees coming out of Syria fleeing the war. It is often said today that the younger generation tend to be quite tight when it comes to financial giving. This group were the complete opposite. I was thrilled to hear that these 2000 young people gave a total of £75,000. This included one girl giving all her life savings of £6,000.

I also saw a photograph at Summer Madness of this largely Protestant group of young people praying for Martin McGuinness (the leader of Sinn Fein) who had been invited to share his hopes for the future of Northern Ireland. Wow! These young people were certainly looking outwards and to the future, and not imprisoned by the history of Northern Ireland.

Once again this year at Harvest let's look upwards and outwards in our gratitude for what we have, and avoid being inward and fearful.

### **2016 Alne Street Fayre**

Another dry day (at least until the clearing-up had to start!) ensured another success for Alne Street Fayre. 2,000 people attended and enjoyed three great music stages together with teas, BBQ, and, of course, the ever-popular bar.

The wide-ranging selection of trade and craft stalls sold everything from soft furnishings and fabrics through to baskets, bird boxes, jewellery and toffee, with a few candles, gifts, plants and cakes in between.

Children enjoyed excellent rides in all sorts of shapes and sizes, and could test their skill with tennis and football speed guns, while the audience could enjoy the amazing birds of prey. This year, the famous Alne Duck Race was flown rather than swum – the winners were 1<sup>st</sup> (£50) Mark Scott-Rix; 2<sup>nd</sup> (£25) Dot Metcalfe; 3<sup>rd</sup> (£15) M. Jackson and 4<sup>th</sup> (£10) Tim Booth.

Many favourable comments were received both on social media and verbally and the 2016 Alne Street Fayre fully lived up to its position as one of *The Times*' Top 20 UK Family Days Out.

Alne Street Fayre is the annual fund-raising activity for Alne Parish Leisure Association (APLA, registered charity no 516566) which runs the sports, leisure and play facilities on the Alne recreation field. While these facilities cost a lot to maintain, insure and improve each and every year, APLA was also able to make a substantial grant last year to Alne Village Hall's renovation project and was also able to continue to support other ventures in the village, such as the Cricket Club. The Fayre also serves to generate income to the village via the Alders Caravan Park and stimulates general interest to visitors with St Mary's Saxon Church and other historical interests such as Alne Cross.
