In light of the current situation caused by the Coronavirus pandemic, it is with some sadness that, after careful consideration, the decision has been taken to cancel the 2020 Alne Street Fayre. The good news is that a new date has been set for **Sunday**, **13**th **June 2021**. We hope that you will look forward with added anticipation to next year's event.

Alne Coronavirus Support Group

A coronavirus support group has been set up in Alne, initiated by the enthusiastic Street Fayre Committee and backed by Alne Parish Council. David Edwards has agreed to be the overall co-ordinator and the village (including Alne Station and Forest Lane) has been split into seven zones, each with its own team leader and its own group of volunteers. Every house should have received a leaflet identifying which zone it is in and who is its team leader with the relevant contact details.

If you are over 70, pregnant, vulnerable or with underlying health conditions, these volunteers have put their hands up to be of service to you. They can do shopping, collect prescriptions, post letters or do anything else (within reason!) that you might be prevented from doing by current government regulations.

Alne Music Club

I originally had the first 3 concerts booked for this year, starting in July, through to the autumn. However, we have been overtaken by the Coronavirus lockdown, and all concerts in front of a live audience are understandably currently on hold. Once the situation returns to something like normal, I will go back to the artists to rearrange new dates.

In the meantime I have not been idle and I have submitted a grant application to the Calor Community Fund. This is for Alne Music Club to acquire a decent Sound System, with speakers, stands, amplifier and microphones, together with some stage lights. Some artists are self-sufficient and bring their own equipment, but others may travel with perhaps just a guitar, and then plug into the public address system provided by the venue. Obtaining our own equipment will save performing artists needing to bring as much gear, and it can also be used to support other events, like travelling theatre, or illustrated talks. We have got through the initial application process, and now individual cases will be judged by the amount of local support they can demonstrate, via a Crowdfunding Campaign.

In the current circumstances where people may have lost their job, and money is likely to be tight for many, I will not be asking for any direct financial contributions. Instead, it will be good to be able to clearly demonstrate the level of local support for our new venture acquiring its own sound and lighting system.

I have now set up a new Alne Music Club Facebook Group Page, and if you can "Like" this page, to show your support for us putting on live quality music concerts in the Village Hall in the future, that will be really helpful. Alternatively, if you don't use Facebook, you can send an e-mail to d.lepper27@btinternet.com, or telephone 01347 838114, leaving your name, so I can report back on the number of supporters that we have for launching this new venture. The greater the support we can demonstrate, the better the chance that we may secure a grant, up to £1,000, to help us with obtaining this initial equipment.

I will keep you posted on how this application proceeds, and in due course will advise you of forthcoming concerts we will be putting on. I will give a profile of each artist we book, together with details of the date, time and cost of the performance. Something positive to look forward to.

York Minster plans Memorial Service to comfort those bereaved by the Covid-19 pandemic

A memorial service to comfort relatives and friends bereaved during the Coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic will take place at York Minster, the Mother Church of Diocese of York, later in 2020.

The impact of the virus, and the national lockdown that has been in place to support the NHS and essential services during the emergency, has made it nearly impossible for relatives and friends to comfort and support their loved ones in their final hours and social distancing measures have resulted in restrictions for funerals and cremations.

The Revd Michael Smith, Canon Pastor at York Minster said that the circumstances have left many people feeling desolate and heartbroken. He said:

"One of the most painful aspects of the current 'lockdown' is that many people have been unable to sit by the side of loved ones as they died or to attend their funerals. When regulations are lifted there will be a Memorial Service at York Minster to enable those bereaved during the pandemic to grieve and to give thanks for loved ones who have died.

"The proposed York Minster Memorial Service will complement local, personal church services held across the Diocese of York for families wishing to commemorate a loved one who they were unable to visit at the end of their life and whose funeral they were unable to attend.

"We will announce the date for this service as soon as we can but we wanted people to know that in addition to what local ministers and churches will be doing for individual families, there will be an opportunity for anyone to come to a service at York Minster to grieve and give thanks for loved ones who have died, and to light a candle in their memory.

"We hope that in this way we will be able to walk alongside all who have been bereaved during the pandemic, and, by sharing the good news of God's love, to bring some comfort and healing to all those who have been unable to grieve properly because of the present situation."
