Thin places

A few years ago, I found myself on a Royal Jordanian flight to Amman and was curious to see what kind of in-flight entertainment would be offered on an Arab airline. Alongside *The Smurfs Film* and readings from the Qur'an, I found an absorbing documentary on the search for the site of Jesus' baptism.

John's Gospel describes the baptism happening at Bethany 'on the other side of the river Jordan', but no such place now exists. But thanks to the discovery of a 6th century mosaic map in nearby Madaba and the 1994 Jordan-Israel peace treaty that allowed the area to be cleared of mines, archaeologists believe they've found it, some distance from the Jordan because the river has shifted its course. They've since been excavating early Christian shrines built at the spot before the memory of it was lost.

Fascinating stuff. But what also caught my interest in watching the documentary was one contributor talking about the concept of 'thin places' – certain locations where heaven seems to stoop very close to earth.

Although, as Christians, we say that God is everywhere and where you worship doesn't matter, it's also part of our belief that we live in parallel worlds – the earthly and the spiritual. Sometimes the spiritual world clearly and decisively breaks in, as happened with the coming of Jesus. But could it be that there are certain locations where the membrane between earth and heaven is extra-thin and the feeling of God's presence more tangible?

I'm sure many of us will have had the experience of sensing something beyond ourselves in particular places. What does it for me is sitting alone in the deep silence of an ancient church where centuries of prayer have imprinted themselves on the atmosphere and the air feels almost palpably thicker. We have a wealth of such churches in our part of North Yorkshire, so why not look one out and see what you discover? The churches at Alne and Aldwark, for example, are open most days during daylight hours and visitors are welcome.

The fact that Christians in every age have gone on pilgrimages to sacred sites speaks further of the spiritual pull of 'thin places'. And if these places exist, the spot where the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus like a dove must surely be one.

BBC Radio 2 Pause for Thought

On 13th June Archbishop Stephen Cottrell gave the Pause for Thought on Zoe Ball's breakfast show on BBC Radio 2

Last month I visited Rome for the first time.

I walked up the Spanish Steps, round the Colosseum, into the Pantheon, drank many delicious cappuccinos, ate gelato and shed loads of lovely pasta. And also had an audience with the Pope. I wasn't sure what to expect.

Would it all be over in a few minutes? Would we shake hands, exchange a few pleasantries, and that would be it? Well, how wrong can you be. I was greeted warmly. He is a very warm human being.

We sat down and chatted. About the scandal of our disunity as Christians; and we laughed about the need for theologians (and bishops!) to catch up with what the Spirit of God is doing in drawing us together. And about the need for all of us to do what we can where we are to make peace, serve the poor, and live sustainably on the Earth.

'We must walk together, work together, and pray together,' said the Pope.

And then we did just that! We prayed the prayer that Jesus taught us. The Lord's Prayer. The prayer that begins, 'Our Father.' He in Italian. I think! Me in English. But both of us speaking the language of the heart which is the language of prayer, the longing for God and the longing to build God's kingdom in the earth.

And as I prayed, I was powerfully struck by that opening word. Our. Not 'my father', not 'my God.' Not 'your father' or 'your God.' Ours.

We belong to each other. And when we say this prayer, we defiantly proclaim that belonging. Despite our divisions, and, despite all the cynical and selfish forces in the world that would drive us apart, we are one humanity, and when we say this prayer, we declare our commitment to each other and to the whole household of God.

Perhaps service sheets in church should carry a health warning. Be careful: this prayer might change you.

Road traffic conditions on the road to Youlton and Aldwark Bridge are very light because of the bridge closure making walking or running more pleasant.

The replacement Kyle Bridge tender for installation process has begun, installation is now projected to be late August or September


depending on weather and access to site. It will make a huge difference to our walking and running routes from the village. We are planning to hold a couple of guided walks on the possible

The trustees are particularly keen to help people who are experiencing financial difficulties caused by the pandemic or the rising cost of household essentials.


The charity also makes grants to local organisations for charitable activities which benefit people in need living in these villages. Organisations must have a bank account and a constitution.
