We were reminded to apply for any of the federation run courses that had been advertised (lots of members are applying for the AXE THROWING!).

Carole & Pauline of: Raskelf & Aldwark, Hedgehog Haven, Hospital & Rehabilitation (Carole Wilson 07895 962659)

An interesting, informative talk followed, given by Carole Wilson, who

explained that it was through her Mum Julie and her grandmother her involvement with that Hedgehog Haven started. Her grandmother looked out of her sheltered accommodation and wondered what was moving on the grass outside her window. whereupon Julie discovered an injured hedgehog, which she took home and nursed back to health, the start of Hedgehog Haven. As a family over the years they have manv. looked after many hedgehogs, becoming part of The British Hedgehog Preservation Society and as time has passed Carole and her husband have taken on what her mother and father started. Carole gave us interesting lots of facts:



hedgehogs spines are made out of hair, they have 2 litters a year, they leave the nest after 7 weeks, cats and dogs do not get lice or fleas from hedgehogs (hedgehog fleas are specific to them). A member asked about "hedgehog houses?". Carole explained why some advertised houses are not suitable as the hedgehog gets their spines stuck in them. They recommended looking or contacting www.britishhedgehogs.org.uk/ who have information sheets, on Hedgehog Homes. People are always getting in touch to ask for help or to bring poorly, lost, hedgehogs into Carole who tries to nurses them back to health with the help of local vets when necessary. Carole introduced us to Pauline who helps with the aftercare of TLC and the release of the hedgehogs back to the wild. Again Pauline and her husband became involved by finding a poorly hedgehog on the disused Linton airstrip, took it to Carole and enquiring about the hedgehog led

Pauline to become a volunteer. These enthusiastic dedicated ladies (& husbands) do this voluntarily. If you need help/information or would like to make a donation of hedgehog food etc. please contact Carole on the phone number on page 5.

We then had supper, hostesses Helen & Maria (which included the special treat of home made authentic focaccia bread & Italian apple cake made by Maria & included Helen's amazing hedgehog).

The supper maybe tea/coffee, a biscuit or cake, the very special part of the evening is the coming together of



everyone, chattering and enjoying each other's company.

River Kyle Depth Gauge

A new record depth was recorded at Alne on 16th January at 1.88 metres above normal. This is the highest since the gauge was installed in December 2021 and exceeds the previous high of 1.78 in February 2022.

Alne Heating Oil Co-operative

The Government are pursuing many initiatives to reduce the consumption of fossil fuels. This includes kerosene (domestic heating oil). Much of the published information indicates a "heat pumps first" approach, such that it is proposed that the sale of oil-fired boilers will be banned from 2026, to be replaced by air or ground source heat pumps. Whilst heat pumps are a perfectly workable solution for new builds, or properties undergoing a major rebuild, they do not work to well as a retrofit to existing installations. It can be done, though usually only with extensive and very expensive upgrades to the system. Future Ready Fuel, a collaboration between OFTEC and UKIFDA, published a detailed response to the Government's Heat Pumps First approach, and can be found on the Future Ready Fuel website.

An alternative is to use a more environmentally friendly fuel - hydrotreated vegetable oil (HVO) - that can be used with existing systems. HVO is produced from waste materials and can cut boiler exhaust emissions by over 80%. Boiler conversion costs are a few hundred pounds. However, HVO is currently taxed as a road fuel, so is not competitive with kerosene.

Before Christmas, a group of coordinators from the Lower Swale Syndicate met with Kevin Hollinrake MP. The meeting was to share our concerns regarding the apparent enforced conversion to heat pumps and the opportunities offered by adopting HVO for domestic heating. The meeting went well and we were assured that there was still much work to be done before policy could be established. With 1.7 million homes off-grid in the UK, a number of options are on the table and there would be no snap decisions.

On 11th January 2023, George Eustice, MP for Camborne and Redruth, introduced a Bill under the Ten Minute Rule to reduce the price of HVO to that of parity with kerosene. The Bill was passed for a second reading on Friday, 3rd March. The first reading is available on BBC iPlayer (search George Eustice Ten Minute Rule Bill) and a transcript may be viewed in Hansard.

The reduction of the reliance on fossil fuels is a subject that affects us all, for many reasons. We, the coordinators, are in communication with Kevin Hollinrake and others, and will aim to stay on top of the debate and contribute where appropriate. The Facebook pages for the Alne Oil Co-operative and the Brafferton Oil Co-operative will be updated as new information comes available. Please consider following either of both.
