Easter: The Greatest Story Ever Told; The Greatest Story Ever Lived.

We – you and I – are invited to join the story

Do you know who Jesus is? Do you know how He lived a human life but was also God? How He reveals God's love to us?

At Easter we celebrate how Jesus overcame death by rising to life again. But the joy and wonder of this unique event are all the more poignant when we remember the pain and horror that Jesus faced as he went to His death on Good Friday.

In the lines page one, I've imagined the thoughts of Mary Magdalen as she approached Jesus' tomb on the first Easter Sunday, grief-stricken at his death but about to discover He was now alive! Easter reminds us that we have a God who has walked the worst of life as well as the best and that He still walks with us now.

Many of us have been deeply moved by the war in Ukraine and the humanitarian need to welcome, shelter and provide for Ukrainians during this horrific time. We have watched the news with abhorrence and possibly also fear. If you'd find prayer helpful, St Mary's Alne and St Stephen's Aldwark are open during the day and have specific areas and resources to help us pray, especially for Ukraine. Also, the Church of England has a 'toolbox of resources' you may find helpful: to find it, go to the Church of England website and search Ukraine.

During Lent in some of our churches in Alne Parish, we've been reading *God on Mute* by Pete Greig. Here Pete reminds us that in Jesus we have a God who lived every facet of humanity – the worst and best of life – and in doing so has shown us how He relates to us in every situation we face. Easter is not the end of the story!

Our leadership team in the Diocese of York is using the phrase, *Living Christ's Story*. This is because Christians believe Jesus is still alive. Having ascended to heaven, He's not walking around on earth any more: instead, He has sent the Holy Spirit to be God with us now.

And we are invited to join in this story – to continue living the love of God revealed in Jesus to the world. It's a story full of pain and challenge, just as Jesus' earthly existence was, but it's also one with hope and joy at its centre. It is, quite simply, the best story to be part of!

Our Archbishop and diocesan leadership team are encouraging us to think about what *Living Christ's Story* looks like today in our communities, villages and churches.

Galegarth, Gale Garth, Gale Road and Back Lane



Scratchboard art is a way of creating a picture using a sharp tool to engrave on a special board with a black surface layer and white under layer.

WI member Jenny is a keen scratchboard artist; she explained the process and showed us some of her own work, which was very detailed and accomplished, we were impressed.



Jenny provided each of us with a small board and sharp engraving knife and then invited us 'to have a go' and create a simple picture. Some of us were a little unsure, but under Jenny's guidance we settled to the task.

The room became very quiet apart from the gentle sound of scratching as we became engrossed in the task and enjoyed spending time being creative.

The Pearson and Others Charitable Trust

The Pearson Trust is a small local charity which was established in 1882 to help people in need who live in the parishes of Aldwark, Alne, Flawith, Tholthorpe, Tollerton and Youlton. The charity makes grants to residents of these villages who are perhaps struggling to meet their everyday living costs or who have a particular need. This might include help to pay for essential household items or repairs, fuel bills, healthcare, or clothing and equipment for a baby or children and young people who are in education or training. All applications are treated in the strictest confidence.

The trustees are particularly keen to help people who are experiencing financial difficulties caused by the pandemic or the rising cost of household essentials.

The charity also makes grants to local organisations for charitable activities which benefit people in need living in these villages. Organisations must have a bank account and a constitution.




The Alne Oil Co-operative is a founder member of the Lower Swale Syndicate of Oil Co-operatives. Collectively, nearly 1,000 Syndicate members purchased 1,789,488 litres of fuel oil in 2021.

With the dreadful events taking place in Ukraine, there has been an inevitable increase in the price of oil on the global market. This has resulted in increased prices for petrol, diesel and, of course, domestic heating oil.

The retail fuel oil market has reacted to ensure that they do not get caught by the steep and unpredictable increase in the price of oil between the order and delivery dates by adding a significant contingency to the price per litre.


Our agreement with the supplier is fundamentally different inasmuch as it ties the price members pay to the commodity (ex-refinery) price for the fuel oil plus a fixed, agreed amount per litre to cover their overheads, delivery charges and profit.



The results can be seen on the graph, where the comparison is between the Syndicate price (solid line) and the daily price quoted on the Boilerjuice website (dashed line). The Boilerjuice price reflects the lowest average price for heating oil in England. (Prices include VAT @ 5%.)

The highest price shown on the Boilerjuice website is 80% above the highest price Syndicate members paid.

Alne Music Club - Boo Hewerdine Concert Friday 20th May 7.30p.m.

Boo Hewerdine is an outstanding English singer-songwriter and record producer. He has been described as "one of Britain's most consistently accomplished songwriters". He has collaborated with a number of other artists, and has a longstanding working relationship with Eddi Reader, writing her hit song "Patience of Angels" for which he was nominated for an Ivor Novello Award. He has produced some of her albums, plays regularly in her touring band, and she has recorded a number of his fine songs over the years. KD Lang covered his song Last Cigarette, and he has recorded and toured with Kris Drever of Lau and more recently worked with Chris Difford of Squeeze. His song "Bell, Book and Candle" has been used in several TV dramas, including an award winning death scene in Emmerdale.

I have seen him in concert performances some 10 times over 25 years, and he has always been a delight. He has a dry sense of humour telling entertaining anecdotes between songs and is a self-deprecating modest performer. His songs are often apparently simple but are actually beautifully carefully crafted. One of my personal favourite albums of his is "God Bless the Pretty Things" which the BBC described as "timeless songs for all seasons....an album of unusual class and sensitivity". He has a special way with words, and memorable tunes that create "ear worms" that stay in your head and linger. I am delighted that we can host him in a concert here in Alne. An evening of fine quality songs to enjoy.
