## A farewell note from your Curate

I am sure by now most of you will have heard that I plan to retire (with permission to officiate) on 17<sup>th</sup> January 2022.

This decision has been extremely difficult, but necessary, as I have been increasingly juggling family and ministry commitments over the last year.

I was licensed as a Reader in the Church of England in April 2009 in Liverpool diocese and began house for duty ministry here in Brafferton and Alne benefices in 2013. I was ordained deacon then priest four years ago, and during all this time I have loved living here among such wonderful people.

The welcome and friendliness of you all played a huge part in mitigating the sense of loss of our very large family back in Liverpool and our homesickness.

Over the almost nine years we have lived and ministered here looking after the six churches, we have had many joys and indeed many challenges. When we first arrived, St Peter's Brafferton was under threat of closure, as the electrics were in such a dangerous condition that we could not get insurance cover. The church was also in desperate need of redecoration and some serious brick and plaster remedial work. We took on the challenge and managed with a lot of meetings and form filling, to secure a lottery grant for £180,000. Then, thanks to the wonderful generosity of our villagers and further grants, we also raised the incredible sum of £30,000. The electrics and redecorating were completed, and the church saved from closure. But this was just the beginning of the work as a later and larger work to replace the failing external masonry needed addressing. Once again people rallied to help, then, just as this was completed, the lead was stolen from the roof!

The sense of community and determination of the local people to fix this was just incredible and we could not have done it without you all. From fund raising to forming a fabric committee to ensure the future stability of the building restored to its glory.

But during this time, the most inspiring thing has been to see the spiritual growth in our communities. Visiting the sick and taking communion into people's homes and witnessing their moving closer to God. Working as a Chaplain at York hospital, praying with families as their loved ones were seriously ill or dying.

Working with our two schools has been a delight from the early days of open the book with Maureen East, Jean Benton, and Barbara White, to our weekly collective worship/assemblies. Harvests and Christingles. Being on the board of Governors for a while too.

The wonderful memories of visiting the local care homes, I have so many funny stories of my visits there....but one thing for sure, God was so clearly present in all those moments.

I have laughed with you at pantomime time, even performed at one of them! Loved our pop-up choirs, and Alne community choir, village barbeques, bonfires, and street fayres. Welcomed many babies and several adults into our church family via baptism. I have had the privilege of marrying couples and praying for their new lives together.

I have held the hands of the dying and wept with you as you have laid family members to rest, having conducted over one hundred funerals since the start of my ministry. I still consider it a great privilege to be asked to take the comfort of the Lord to grieving families at such a sad time.

But all of this I have done not in my strength alone, but in the strength of the Holy Spirit who has always been by my side in tough times.

The over two-year vacancy when our last Priest in charge, Chris Park, moved to another post, then this year as our new Priest in charge has sadly been so unwell, has been particularly difficult. I give a heartfelt thanks to all the lay teams, wardens, acting wardens and retired Vicars, who have helped and supported me through.

But I also need to give all my love and deep deep thanks to my wonderful family, who have sacrificed so much so that I can be here. Missing family occasions and so many Christmases together and me taking their dad so far away from them!

Which brings me to my final point. When we came over the hill to Yorkshire, all those years ago, Bill was diagnosed with Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis. He was given 2-5 years to live then. This man is my inspiration, fighting on and supporting me so much over the years. He took on the role of Treasurer in Brafferton and was instrumental in securing all the grants over the years. He has been my rock and has gracefully accepted the times I was called out during the wee small hours to a dying person or have been away from home for days during my ordination training. And the separation from our family. Now as his health has seriously deteriorated, it is time for me to spend some quality time with him, to make some happy memories with our family together.

As he could no longer manage the stairs, we have moved to a bungalow in Carlton Miniott. It is small and cosy, and I am not sure Holly doggy is too pleased!! She misses the large garden at Alne (a lot less for me to look after though!).

We have been blessed to have made many, many, lifelong friends, and you know who you are. Bill and I would love to have visitors, so do keep in touch, and please keep us in your prayers. We would be happy to see you in our new home.

But I will be carrying out all the usual advent and Christmas services so may see you then. My last service will be in Alne church on **Sunday**, **16**<sup>th</sup> **January at 10.30a.m.** This will be a joint benefices service so I hope you can make it to say goodbye. We have too many memories to put down here, but will treasure them.

Once again, thank you all for your love and support over our time here with you, for the joy, the laughter, and the tears. May God bless you richly.

Joan introduced speaker: Jean Yorston and her talk on "Base Camp Everest. Jean is one of our members, I remember at one of our meetings asking what she had been doing since last month. "Oh, I went to Base Camp Everest" not an answer I was expecting!

Jean who is 79 YEARS YOUNG joined her daughter, her granddaughter and her daughter's friend to make her expedition. Jean packed her bags, including fleeces, walking boots and outdoor clothes that had been donated for Sherpas, which at Heathrow were distributed through everyone's luggage.



The flight was delayed, which in turn meant they missed their connecting flight from Delhi to Kathmandu. The airline promised if they flew to Calcutta there would be a hotel in the airport & they would fly them back to Delhi the next day! Unfortunately, the hotel didn't exist, they slept on a very thin carpet on a floor! They did fly the next day, Calcutta-Delhi-Kathmandu, into the most dangerous airport in the world on board a 16-seater plane filled with passengers and carrots! First stop a toilet.

The party was met by their Sherpas. A good meal & nights rest prepared them for the 5 hour trek the next day. They were told they must always stay on the inside of the pathway as a sheer drop was on the other. They were passed by men and Yaks, carrying an assortment of goods, fridges, freezers, carrots, etc. everything must be carried to base camp, there are no roads. Jean did 4 more treks, ranging from 7 to 4 hours a day, including crossing 3 suspension bridges (no mean feat for someone afraid of heights but her strong faith got her across), unfortunately, as the air was getting thinner and the thought of holding the party back, Jean made the decision to return to Kathmandu. 2 Sherpas brought her back, who respectfully referred to her as Momma Jean.

Jean is still bemused that so many people wanted to have a selfie photograph with her. Jean was an amazing speaker and inspirational person.

Maggie and Helen provided us with a wonderful supper to round off the meeting.

Afterwards the annual (much anticipated & enjoyed) charity Tombola organised by our President Joan was held. This year the fantastic sum of £145 raised will go to the Motor Neurone Disease Charity.

Next meeting **Wednesday**,  $8^{th}$  **December** – Christmas Fun. Visitors (£3) always given a warm welcome.
