What an exciting month June is for us as a nation and a church! We begin this month with two significant events.

The first, of course, is the Queen's platinum Jubilee, for which celebration events are being planned in communities across the country. In our own villages there are activities taking place across the Bank Holidays and these offer a chance to meet friends old and new and bring communities together. There are more details about some of these events inside this magazine.

This is the first time that any British monarch has celebrated a Platinum Jubilee, and after 70 years on the throne very few of us will even be able to remember anything other than living in Elizabethan times.

The Queen's reign has been marked by almost unimaginable changes in society and in the world. Her coronation was credited with kick starting the television age, now screens are just about everywhere. Her first Christmas broadcast in 1952 was only on the radio, her latest in 2021 could be watched on TikTok or heard on Amazon Alexa.

The Queen has been a constant presence in an ever-changing world, and it is a testament to her humility and service that, though scandals may have rocked her family and a great number of her governments, the Queen herself remains an inspiration to many.

There was one moment in her coronation which was not televised, as it was deemed too sacred. This was the moment when the symbols of her status – the crimson robe, the diamond diadem, the coronation necklace – were removed, and the Archbishop of Canterbury anointed the new Queen with holy oil.

The Queen has spoken since of how this moment was the most significant one of her life, as in humility she was dedicated to a life of service and called to follow the example of Jesus who himself gave his life for others.

It is fitting then that the other significant and exciting celebration taking place on the first weekend in June is the feast of Pentecost. This is when we remember the gift of God's Holy Spirit to the Church, that Spirit of love and service which binds all people together and fills each and every one of us with the guiding presence of God.

The early Christians, after receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, dedicated their lives to one another. As the book of Acts in the New Testament puts it, "All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had. God's grace was so powerfully at work in them all that there were no needy persons among them."

As we approach this weekend with its multitude of celebrations may we all be inspired – whether by the Holy Spirit, by the many years of humble service of her Majesty the Queen, or both – to dedicate our lives to the service of our fellow humans, in our own communities and around the world.

I hope to see you at points during the festivities, but if not, I hope you have a wonderful and blessed June.

#### Alne WI Meeting 11<sup>th</sup> May 2022

The meeting was opened by Joan Baram (President) who was pleased to welcome everyone including new members and visitors. Diana Hunter (Secretary) then gave several apologies and informed us of upcoming events.

On 28<sup>th</sup> May the production of "Mrs Beeton my sister" will be on in the village hall, which we will be supporting with The Village Hall. On Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June, there will be a WI Jubilee Cafe, members volunteered to bake, prepare the hall & host the event.

This evening's speaker: Laura Colenso (In Flow Yoga) - speaking about, Hatha yoga for women. Laura, started by sharing how she started on her road to the practice of yoga whilst pregnant. Yoga had enabled her to breathe through 33 hours of labour with just gas and air. After a personal accident in the family, Laura realised that yoga could be the practice that could give her strength externally & internally, through the next few years and beyond.

Yoga is the practice of Body, Breath, Mind & Spirit. Its benefits are many: strength, balance, physical & mental well-being, improve bone density, makes you more supple, helps with blood pressure. It also helps coping with, anxiety, depression, stress, sleep problems. Yoga practice encourages self-care, recover and rest, respond rather than react.

Laura teaches Hatha Yoga for women, explaining how yoga goes through female life cycle, maiden, mother and crone (a big response to that word), which symbolises a separate stage in the female life cycle. We finished with all joining in with breathing exercises. We asked questions at the end, "can anyone do it?", "are you ever too old?", "can you stay seated?". The answer to all the questions was "Yoga is for everyone & is adaptable to your needs". Laura's passion for yoga, was joyful, her talk was informative & insightful, a wonderful speaker. 
# Alne Oil Co-operative

Time has allowed for a more detailed analysis of the facts and figures behind the 1,789,488 litres of fuel oil the members of the Lower Swale Syndicate of Heating Oil Co-operatives purchased during 2021.

We use the figures posted by Boilerjuice as a benchmark. Boilerjuice take the average of the lowest price from each postcode in their supplier network. Whilst there will be regional variation, it's a reasonably reliable comparator.

During 2021, members made an average saving of 5.69p/litre (incl. VAT @ 5%) or 11.2%. The saving does vary according to a number of factors, but the Boilerjuice price was always higher than the syndicate price. As the syndicate price is tied to the ex-refinery price, the savings are greatest when the bulk oil price is fluctuant and retailers include a larger margin.

The results can be seen on the graph, where the comparison is between the Syndicate price (solid line) and the Boilerjuice price (dashed line).



With more marked changes in the bulk price for oil brought about by action in Ukraine, savings will almost certainly be greater this year, as evidenced by a 50% saving during March, when prices were rising steeply. 
