Public Forum

Electrical supply for Christmas lights on the Green was brought into the public forum – There were no firm estimates for the electrical supply. There was an update on using solar lights however having investigated using solar lights it was felt they were not suitable. While discussing the village green it was brought to the Councils attention that there is no access for people using a wheelchair due to no dropped kerb it was agreed to make enquiries of having a dropped kerb on the green. Regarding the fence posts on the green the Post directly opposite the shop is constantly being damaged, it was felt we need steel posts on the corners to prevent further damage. The Clerk to ask FFT Lumber to attend to this.

A Parishioner was present who currently has an allotment to enquire about payment of her allotment, she also asked if it was possible to have a shed and poly tunnel on the allotment – Council did not see a problem with this.

A Parishioner attended on advice from NYCC advising there are parking issues in Kyle Close and due to her not being able to get her car out of the drive she has missed hospital appointments, the Parishioner asked if we can apply for double yellow lines on the left hand side of Kyle Close. The Parishioner was advised to speak to the Police to see if they will come and discuss the problem with the residents of Kyle Close.

A Parishioner attended to ask for the Parish Councils help with a planning issue he has had on trying to get planning permission for an extension of his property. Council advised they had supported all four of his planning applications and were surprised when he lost his appeal.
