THE VICAR'S LETTER



Exam Pressure

At this time of the year many of our young people are sitting exams – GCSEs, A-Levels or finals. The pressure to revise and achieve is great. There is great pressure on the teachers with league tables, Ofsted inspections, financial incentives for better results, and so on. The pressure on young people can come from their peers – competing to get the highest mark (or lowest for the rebellious) – and from their families – the expectation that they will earn at least as much as they do!

As educational performance is measured more and more by exam results, this can then have the effect of de-humanising our young people. Not everyone is blessed with great academic ability. Some struggle with mental and emotional health problems. Some have dyslexia, some are caring for sick relatives, some have very difficult relationships to deal with in the home. This Summer some may find themselves defined for the first time as 'failures' or as 'successes.'

How young people respond to this pressure varies. At one extreme some may give up completely. I had a school friend who decided to leave school rather than sit exams. He wanted to be a mechanic, had got an apprenticeship and so left when he was 16 years old. At the other extreme young people can make themselves ill with anxiety, working night and day pursuing perfect results. Of course most students lie somewhere in between these two extremes.

While the rigours of academic study may be in the past for many of us, there are still lessons we can learn. It is right that we encourage young people to do as well as they can in their academic studies, but only within the circumstances of their lives, and not as well as is theoretically possible. Young people need not be defined by their exam results.

However well our young people do in their exams, they still need to know that they are loved for who they are and not because of their exam results. This is the same for us all. God loves us because he does, not because of our achievements.

#### Pentecost... Living Spirit

Today we want everything quickly and in a hurry; fast food, fast cars, fast living, wham, woosh and explosively presented. Even a visit to a restaurant will see our puddings and desserts presented with fireworks and fizzling sparklers. We love to see explosions and excitement. The best films to see at the cinema are the ones with plenty of special effects, usually consisting of cars blowing up and buildings crumbling to the ground in spectacular fashion. We love to see demonstrations of power in all its cinematic glory.

We also try to harness power from the water, from the sun, and from wind turbines, and as a world that has only finite resources this seems the right thing to do. It is sad that we have abused the world's natural resources so much in the past, that now we need to find alternative sources of energy. But power can be used in at least two ways: it can be unleashed, or it can be harnessed. The energy in ten gallons of petrol, for instance, can be released explosively by dropping a lighted match into the can. Or it can be channelled through the engine of a car in a controlled burn and used to transport a person 350 miles. Explosions are spectacular, but controlled burns have lasting effect, staying power.

As we approach Pentecost we learn that the Holy Spirit works both ways. At Pentecost, he exploded on the scene; His presence was like "tongues of fire" (Acts 2:3). Thousands were affected by one burst of God's power. But He also works through the church--the institution God began, to tap the Holy Spirit's power for the long haul. Through worship, fellowship, and service, Christians are provided with staying power. All too often we try to achieve things through our own human strength and become burned out and tired. Faith in God through the Holy Spirit, gives us an inner energy that is perpetually renewable and free for all!

Could your power supply do with a little recharging? Why not try this prayer today...

Holy God, whose power is known through wind, fire, and still small voice, be present with us now, that as we pray, our hearts may burn within us, and we may yearn for the knowledge and nearness of our living God. Amen
