### A Lenten Reflection

Lent is a season in which we prepare ourselves to celebrate Easter. Lent is a season of reflection, re-evaluation, repentance and reconciliation. Lent is a time of profound grace; and we are invited to let that grace sink in, take root and change us. Through our observance of these days, by



listening to the Scripture from the Lenten liturgies and by participating in the traditional practices of the Church, we are invited; in this holy season, to be stripped down, and cleansed from all the obstacles that keep us from seeing our true selves clearly, stripped down so that we may come to understand more powerfully the Love of God who embraces all of who we are.

There are many ways to enter into the spirit of the season and to "observe" these days. It is not so important what we do as it is important that we do something to make these days different from all the rest. One great way to enter into this season is by following the traditional practices of the Church which are: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. What is great about these practices is that they give us a way to enter into this season of healing with body and soul; physically and spiritually.

Almsgiving, which is more than just giving away money but also giving of our time through serving the needs of those around us, is a practice which encourages us to let go of things (money, possessions, our valuable time) which may have taken on too high a priority in our lives. Almsgiving encourages us to strip away those "things" which can cause us to be separated from one another. It also challenges us to take a serious look at distinguishing between what we need and what we want.

In the same spirit of examining our needs and wants, fasting, (which is a practice of rearranging our eating habits either by cutting down on consumption or by abstaining all together), helps us to be reminded of our need for God to fill us. Fasting allows us to feel physically the on going spiritual needs of the soul and can help us to feel the truth that only God can truly satisfy our deepest longings. Almsgiving and fasting help us to do, to feel, to tangibly experience the season of Lent. Prayer is the other traditional practice in the Church, and through prayer we are able to experience Lent on a spiritual level. Prayer slows us down, allows us to be focused, and enables us to be stripped away from our obsession with this world and moves us to a higher consciousness. Prayer allows us to "see" our life and our works with the eyes of faith that opens the heart to seeing God in the midst of it all.

As we approach the season of Lent, with its message of hope, rebirth and new beginnings, let us take time to reflect on our lives, especially the spiritual side. Is the Lord calling you to come to know him better? Can you make a little time to make that journey with Him? Blessings to you all, Carmel.



#### POVERTY - IN TOLLERTON, ALNE & HELPERBY? HAMBLETON FOODSHARE

It may surprise you, that despite the image that all is well in and around Easingwold and its surrounding villages, sadly for some, this is far from reality. We are a relatively affluent area, but the bitter truth for some of our neighbours is of a never ending and grinding struggle to feed and warm their families - and it's getting harder all the time.

Whatever your politics - forget the hype that you see on TV's Benefit Street, most of those in need are already in employment of some kind - the reality is that the vast majority of people who find themselves in need are genuine honest people who require urgent help.

The problem is that when you live on the bread line, year on year, it does not take much to push you under - a period of time without work because of illness (not everyone gets sick pay) or sudden emergencies at home can mean disaster for those with only pennies left at the end of each week.

There isn't always a safety net. Benefits are harder and harder to obtain and payment to those entitled is often delayed. And poverty is harder in rural areas like Easingwold & Villages, where agencies are based far away and travel is expensive and infrequent.

It is also our direct experience that most local people in need do not want to accept "help", or "benefits". Many Yorkshire folk are too proud for that, and see a need for help as their own failure, or are worried about being called a "scrounger". Which is why you won't see or hear about them. You may not be aware that those living next door to you are not coping financially. Would you tell your next door neighbour or friends that you had no money to feed your children or pay the electricity bill?

Christ told us that one day he would remind each of us of how we responded to Christ's own hunger, even though we did not recognise his hunger at the time in those around us living in need. Christ also commands us to love our neighbour as we love ourselves, and it is with this in mind that a group of local Christians have launched a facility to help just those very neighbours in our area who are in need.

We have joined up with the Hambleton Foodshare (a Foodbank project in Northallerton) to offer help to people and families in need who live among us here in Easingwold and surrounding villages – and we have quietly been doing this for a few months now. Our local community donates food items - and we see to it that they go to those in hardship. We believe "Foodshare" is a great term for what we are doing.

Since starting the project we have moved from a communal drop-in centre to a telephone based system - one where you leave a message or send a text with your contact details and we then call you back to discuss your needs and how we can help. The number to call is **0772 44 44 750** - and we promise that we will get back to you as soon as we can, normally the same day. Please call or text us if you need help - or indeed if you know anybody else who does. You can be assured that all calls will be confidential and your details will not be passed on to any other agency without your consent.

Poverty is real and here in Easingwold & Villages - we have seen it all too often. Please pray and help us to be effective at helping those around us in need.

Not long ago, when she was in her thirties, she suffered a catastrophic cerebral bleed resulting in a stroke. She was given a very small chance to live. An amazingly positive person she explained, that the worst result was loss of short term memory, and her sadness when she found that she couldn't care for her children herself. After a while in a residential rehabilitation centre she had made progress and returned home and back to family life. Though a serious subject Sally Ann gave us a very heartening and sometimes amusing account of her experiences, about which she has now published a book. We felt a warm glow that such a lovely person

had not just survived but had made such a good recovery.

#### Superfast Broadband is Coming to Our Villages

Residents of Alne, Tholthorpe and Tollerton will soon benefit from BT's Superfast Broadband, and can contact the internet service provider of their choice to upgrade to a superfast broadband service. But people in the outlying parishes will not be able to get this as it is uneconomical for BT to upgrade the local telephone lines and bring optical fibre to these villages. Aldwark Area Parish Council thought this was unfair and through Superfast North Yorkshire, arranged a public meeting in January to consider alternative options. This was attended by over 50 residents and as a result, L N Communications, also trading as 'I Love Broadband', is now being supported to provide a Superfast High Quality Broadband for Flawith, Youlton Aldwark and Myton on Swale using modern radio technology. They currently operate this service to residents of Ouseburn and Dunsforth.

Prices are similar to that of other superfast broadband service providers, but customers will need to pay for a small receiver about the size of a carton of milk, mounted on a high point on the house in line of sight of one of the repeaters that have recently been erected in the villages. The cost of a receiver and a new router, if required, should not exceed £140. The receiver will be connected by a cable to a router and you will have a superfast broadband service that can satisfy the most discerning people working from home and teenagers playing games or streaming films and music.
