What is this symbol?



This is actually the Arabic letter 'n' and it is the symbol which is being daubed on the houses of Christians in Syria and Iraq by the Islamic movement Isis. For Isis it means 'n' for 'Nasrani' – Nasarines in our language or Christians. Isis then target these families (including women and children)

with horrific brutality – including beheading and impaling the heads of their victims on stakes as trophies. They are also crucifying Christians.

I am sure that you are all aware of the brutality of Isis following the news coverage particularly since the beheading of the two US journalists and British Aid Worker. However, it is not just Christians and Westerners who are being targeted. It is anyone who does not subscribe to the Isis expression of Islam.

How might we respond? Some of the young Christians I left behind in Manchester are now using the 'Nasrani' symbol to identify themselves on social media as a way of standing with the Christians who are suffering. Certain Aid agencies can be supported financially and it is possible to correspond over the internet with people who are suffering. We can also pray. Recently Archbishop Sentamu completed eight days of prayer and fasting for peace and reconciliation in Iraq and Syria. Instead of eight days I would like to invite the whole community to join me in fasting one meal and praying on Friday 10th October. We fast in order to empty ourselves of self and focus on the things of God. If you are not used to praying then why not use the Lord's Prayer or 'Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy.' These were the prayers which Archbishop Sentamu used. I shall be in the Lady Chapel at St Mary's Alne at 1pm on Friday 10th October to pray quietly. If you would like to join me you would be very welcome. However we can pray anywhere. What matters is that we do it.

Giving Life

I love my garden, and one of the things that gives me great pride in living here, is how so many other people put a lot of work into their gardens too.



There's something about those green plants and colourful flowers that calls us to endure heat, sore backs, weeds and bugs. It is amazing that we do so for such a short, growing season.

Soon all the plants and flowers, colours and textures, will be gone. Why work so hard for something that is temporary? **Because it gives us life**. Green is the colour of life and growth. It's the colour we wait for throughout the winter. I remember one winter that was so white, I got excited the first time I saw brown earth. Brown, as we know, comes before green. Green is the colour of the plants pushing up out of the earth, reaching for the sun. Green is the colour of the leaf buds, sprouting out on branches. Like those plants and buds, we reach for life.

Do you receive life when you're at the river or taking a walk through the fields? Do you pause for a moment and remember God, who created all this beauty and the cycle of life for us all to enjoy? Think about what you do put time into, and ask yourself if it gives you life. If it does, be glad, for God, the giver of life is with you. If it doesn't, God is still with you, but you might reconsider your use of time and energy. Maybe it's something you have to do regardless, but maybe it's something you can change.
