<u>Fair Trade Fortnight</u> 26th February – 11th March 2018

Dear Parishioners

After the supernatural interventions surrounding Messiah's birth, everything apparently settles down to a more familiar rhythm. Yet, God is working in preparation for the ministry that will ultimately open the doors long shut between heaven and earth. Once more it will become possible for God's kingdom to be expressed in the earth as it is in heaven. Mary, Joseph and Jesus return to Nazareth, where Jesus grows into adulthood, growing in strength and wisdom, with God's grace recognisably upon him.

At times I grow frustrated with the normality of life. The daily round of rising, eating, working and managing life's irritations almost crushes me. I grow bored with the repetitive cycle. I struggle to find the energy to bother. But then I remember who it is that has called me to this place and this life. How can I complain when Jesus, my saviour, has given His life for me? Over the Christmas season I was so encouraged to see so many of you in our churches, exciting times lay ahead; times of challenge and adventure, and in the ordinariness of daily life, we do well to remember the joy peace and indeed excitement that dwells within us when we discover the living Christ and invite him into our lives. I look forward to a time of growth, reflection and challenge and offer myself again in the service of God and of you all this coming year.

Easingwold Community Library offers a **free service** for people of all ages who, because of ill health or disability, find it difficult to get to the library or carry books. **The service is also available to carers**.

Our volunteers will select books to suit the customer's tastes and they can either be collected from the library by a friend or relative or we can deliver directly to the customer every two weeks. Our delivery volunteers are all DBS checked and cover Easingwold and all the surrounding villages. We offer **free access** to books (including large print and children's), audio books, DVDs, music on CD and information

Users can **opt in and out** so can use the service if they are recovering from an illness or operation or can't get out in bad weather.
