#### Gazza 'prays' he won't go back to drink

Former footballer Paul Gascoigne has said he **prays** that he will not pick up another drink. The ex-England player has struggled with mental illness, drugs and alcohol addiction for more than 15 years. He recently said: "I just pray I don't pick up another drink, I don't want to but I just stay strong for you guys.

# "I love the world, I love the people in it and the most important bit, you know, today I love myself."

Gascoigne, said he was now **"in a good place"**, just weeks after he won victory in the High Court and was awarded damages for phone hacking by Mirror Group Newspapers. But he added that he suspected he had been hacked again "a few weeks ago".

"I don't look for perfection, I look for progress," he said. "I'm happy and I'm enjoying life, may it continue, but sometimes I find it hard when I wake up in the morning and there's lies written about us again."

The above article is a brave and honest admission by Paul Gascoigne. His decline and desperation was well documented and reported in the media, and many felt deeply saddened by his apparent waste of talent and ability, to drink and drugs. Many others felt little pity saying he had more money than sense, but the real issue is how he suffered with self-doubt and paranoia compounded by the media hacking his phone and making him and his family believe that he was going insane. His private conversations reported and

blown up in the national papers! Who could he trust? No wonder he felt paranoid!

We build up these young footballers to celebrity status, give them and other celebrities more money than they know what to do with, want to know every detail of their lives, and buy newspapers that run stories that we constantly yearn to read, whether they are true or not. And the sad thing is that many young people today when asked what they want to do when they grow up, will reply that they want to be famous. Fame and fortune seems to be all that is aspired to, with the famous earning immoral amounts of cash for little or no work or skills.

It is immoral to pay people millions for their salary. Who needs more than to live comfortably? There is more to life than flash cars, extravagant homes, and exotic holidays. Paul Gascoigne has had to pay the hard way for his return to health. He has lost so much along the way, and in a recent TV interview, he said that the thing he missed the most was the banter and fun he had enjoyed with the friends he left behind when he left football. Not the extravagant way of life and all the temporary pleasures he had been able to get, but the love and care and trust of those he had loved. His life was ruined by money, hangers on, and our desire to know every intimate detail of his life. How wonderful that now he seems well on the road to getting his life back on track. And that he believes that prayer will help to get him through.

But really were we not complicit in his demise? How many other people will meet the same fate; when we worship them beyond reason, pay them silly money, and lead these young and vulnerable people to believe that they are superhuman, beyond the law and not accountable for their behaviour?

The power of prayer is amazing.

You may have noticed some buses round the York diocese with TRY PRAYING on the sides or back. This has been accompanied by some little booklets that we are encouraged to "use and lose" i.e. read ourselves and then give away. A brilliant sunny day ensured another great success for Alne Street Fayre. 2,300 people (close to an all-time record) poured through the gates to enjoy four great music stages together with teas, BBQ, and, of course, the ever-popular bar.

The wide-ranging selection of trade and craft stalls sold everything from antique books through baskets and bird boxes to jewellery and toffee, with a few dog biscuits, gifts, plants and soaps in between.

Children were catered for with excellent rides, including a massive giant slide which had even the *aficionados* nervously clutching their stomachs. The usual range of competitions was supplemented by tennis and cricket speed gun trials which had the adults queuing up and attempting (usually in vain) to beat the juniors. Nature-lovers could enjoy the Birds of Prey and the Reptile House.

Many, many favourable comments were received both on social media and verbally and the 2015 Street Fayre fully lived up to its position as one of *The Times*' Top 20 UK Family Days Out.

## Aldwark Area Parish Council

## Chairman's Annual Report to the Parish Assembly on 14<sup>th</sup> May 2015

The chair, Colin Stroud welcomed new members to the Council following the May election, namely Gemma Boddy and Andy Follington for Aldwark and John Topliss for Flawith. He thanked the retiring members, Henry Dean, Roland Crooke and Allan Boddy for their long service and achievements. Contact details for parish councillors can be found on the parish website at www.aldwarkparish.co.uk He also thanked Aldwark Manor Hotel for kindly providing a room for parish meetings free of charge.

#### Parish Clerk

Since the clerk's salary was the main expenditure on the council's small precept, when the clerk resigned in July, to keep costs down, the parish council decided not to have a paid clerk, and instead the jobs previously carried out by the clerk were shared amongst the other councillors in an unpaid capacity. This arrangement has worked well and will be continued by the new council.

#### Waste Spreading

Since the waste spreading agreement with Coast to Coast Recycling Ltd was reached last year no major problems have been reported.

#### Superfast Broadband North Yorkshire

As a result of the council's efforts during the year, LN Communications has provided Superfast Broadband to residents of Aldwark using modern radio technology. Despite a grant from Hambleton DC plans to provide a similar service to Flawith and Youlton, this was eventually abandoned due to technical difficulties. However, BT is now planning to extend its own service to Flawith by the end of 2016 though sadly not to Youlton.

#### Roads, pavements, footpaths and grass verges

At long last the worst parts of the road from Aldwark village to Aldwark Bridge have been repaired. We are again grateful to Cllr Boddy and others for their generous personal efforts to keep our verges in good order during the year.

#### **Grass- Cutting**

Due to budget cuts within North Yorkshire County Council the PC has lost a grant of about £500 for amenity grass-cutting in 2015. Consequently the PC has asked all householders to cut their own verges wherever possible. This will be closely monitored and due to savings made during the year, the PC has sufficient reserves to pay for grass-cutting where it is needed.

#### Speeding

Measures to reduce traffic speeding through our villages are being explored.
