# Thy Kingdom Come!



These words, 'thy kingdom come', will be familiar to many of you as coming from the Lord's Prayer.

From Ascension until Pentecost this year ( $25^{th}$  May –  $4^{th}$  June) we are all invited to join in a global wave of praying.

In order to support this prayer initiative we will have material available in all of our churches to help encourage us to pray ordinary prayers to our extraordinary God. All of our churches, except Tollerton, are open during the day, so do please make use of this opportunity to join with millions all over the world praying for God's kingdom to come on earth as it is in heaven.

One of the questions I like to wrestle with is what would it look like if God's kingdom did come 'on earth as it is in heaven'. Can I suggest that the following are some of the answers to this question:

- The hungry would be fed and the homeless given homes.
- The sick would be healed.
- The lonely would be established in loving communities.
- Resources would be shared equitably.
- Creation would be cared for reduce, re-use, recycle!
- God would be worshipped unhindered and uninhibited!

As God's people we are called to pray and work for heaven on earth. If it is happening in heaven we long for it to happen here. (e.g. There are no poor or sick people in heaven – so we work to help the poor and sick here.) If what we see happening here does not happen in heaven, then we reject it here on earth!

## 'Do you believe in God?'



As I prepare to move on from my role here as vicar I wanted to ask you this rhetorical question, 'do you believe in God?' and to explain what I do and do not mean when I say, 'I believe in God.'

The gospels tell a story of Jesus on a journey with his friends from the area around Lake Galilee to Jerusalem. This physical journey for his friends is also a journey of incredible spiritual awakening. They see the blind and crippled healed. Jesus walks on water and raises the dead. Then in Jerusalem hope becomes despair at the crucifixion and then hope and incredulous joy explodes into being at the resurrection.

However, belief in God for me is not simply about believing the Jesus story, in the same way as I would believe the stories about Constantine or Alexander the Great. Neither is it about trying to persuade anyone to believe the unbelievable when it comes to the miracles Jesus performed and that he died and rose from the dead. It is not about trying to sell Jesus as being in some way a superior spiritual choice in the market place of spirituality. An abstract belief in whether something is true or not, is not what I mean by belief in God.

Belief in God for me is an experienced reality, in much the same way as when you are in love with someone. When you are in love, your behaviour changes towards someone. There may be evidence of flowers and chocolates, but love itself is not something we prove so much as experience. Belief in God for me is similar to this.

For me this belief is about discovering God's love for me as a personal experience. It is realising that there is a God who knows me completely and is for me. That there is a God who I can talk to, and who speaks to me, a God revealed in Jesus whose love I can experience today. This experience of knowing God's love happened to me first in my late teens and has continued to happen ever since. Having made this discovery I am then faced with the choice of how to respond to the challenge of Jesus to 'come follow me!'

My own story has been that experiencing the love of God has led to belief and understanding rather than the other way around.

So what about you? Let me ask you again. 'Do you believe in God?' or should I say 'have you experienced the love God has for you personally?' If so how have you responded?


#### New life!

The work to refurbish the old kitchen started on time as planned and should be finished by the end of April. Call in if you get the chance and see what a great new space this gives us. It is going to be the warmest part of the entire building so will



be perfect for small groups of up to about 10 people, to get together for leisure activities and meetings. It has its own entrance, toilet facilities and basic kitchen facilities so users can make refreshments. It can also be used independently from the main hall, so gives us greater capacity for users. This is all thanks to a grant from Wren FCC Community Action Fund. We are planning an event to celebrate the opening of this great new facility and will have more news on this next month.

The work to replace all the flat roofed areas of the hall is planned to start in early May. This is partly funded by a £10,000 grant from the Big Lottery Awards. We will however be funding a major part of this work from our own reserves so we need to work hard to raise money and replace the amount we will be spending so that we can continue to maintain and improve the facilities we can offer.

Latest (31<sup>st</sup> March) delivered price for kerosene was **35.97ppl** + VAT. The corresponding Boilerjuice price was 38.26ppl.

#### If you are already a Co-operative Member and need oil, either:

- log onto Tate's website <u>www.tateoil.co.uk</u> (preferred option), look on the blue menu bar for the Buying Groups tab (centre top), select LSOS (Lower Swale Oil Syndicate) to login (you will need the password provided by Tate), then fill in the online form with your requirements, or
- If unable to use website, phone the dedicated Lower Swale order line 01943 854888

Members can order at any time — Tate Fuels has undertaken to deliver within 10 working days from order, though deliveries will often arrive sooner. The price charged will be that applying on the delivery date, and is calculated from the commodity price plus an agreed margin.

If not a Member, why not join? — you will undoubtedly save money by comparison with your existing supplier and Tate's service has been outstanding! #### New Bridge Allotments – Tollerton

Tollerton Parish Council has developed 7 new allotments in response to demand from our local residents. These are situated to the south of Poppy Croft just down Intake Lane which turns off Sykes Lane. These are now called the New Bridge Allotments due to the generous gift of a new parking area for the allotments created by AMCO Rail.

The wild area below the new carpark is to be redeveloped as an orchard area with fruit trees that anyone from the village can pick. This is a boggy area and so the lowest part next to the pond will be left as a wildlife bog area. We hope that the area next to the carpark will be dry enough for people to picnic if they wish.

Some 12 bags of litter were picked up from in and around the village including the junction of Warehills Lane and Newton Road; and between the Station Inn and the end of the caravan park. Further litter picks will continue throughout the year in an effort to keep the village tidy.

#### Aldwark, Flawith and Youlton Parish Assembly 9<sup>th</sup> May at 7.00p.m.

All residents of Aldwark, Flawith and Youlton are invited to this open meeting on **Tuesday**, **9**<sup>th</sup> **May at 7.00p.m.** at **Aldwark Manor Hotel**. Although it is organised and chaired by the Parish Council, it is not a formal Council meeting but an opportunity for local people to raise any matters of concern or interest.

For example the Parish Council would like to hear how people in Aldwark would like us to spend the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) payment of £5,197 received from Hambleton District Council in respect of the development 3 new houses in the village. This can be used in any way which improves the village infrastructure such as new play or leisure equipment, anti-speeding measures or improvement to broadband reception - and must be spent within 5 years. We would also like to discuss a suggestion to develop an e-mail communication network within the villages.

We hope you will come along and have your say. If there are particular matters that you would like to raise and wish to discuss before the meeting please contact me.
