

Harvest - a time for giving!

For the past few years at Harvest Festival all the churches and primary schools in our area donated non-perishable food to support the work of the Salvation Army in York. We also now have boxes at a number of our churches for people to

leave donations of food for the Hambleton Food Share, which is our local food bank.

The stories I increasingly hear now, are of people in need who we might call the 'working poor.' We hear that unemployment is down, but that inflation continues to outstrip pay rises and so, increasingly, it is those in low paid work who are in need of help, not just the unemployed and those on benefits.

Again this year at Harvest we will support the work of the Salvation Army through the churches and schools at Harvest Festivals. However, please do not forget the work of the Hambleton Food Share. The Hambleton Food Share boxes are now in our churches



permanently. Though we live in a very affluent part of the UK there are still folk who struggle in our communities and who desperately need our help. Please donate non-perishable food including, tins, pasta, rice, tea, coffee, sugar, breakfast cereals etc.

Weeds and Flowers!

At this time of year, the weeds in my garden seem to grow up faster than the flowers, and often faster than I can pull them up. Mind you, I have to be



careful when I yank them out, for the roots of the weeds are all tangled up with the roots of the flowers I planted. If I'm too vigorous, I also pull up the flowers I was trying to protect. A weed is only a plant in the wrong place, and sometimes I leave them there to enjoy them until autumn comes, when I pull them all up together and sort out which to throw away, and which to replant.

Jesus told a parable which echoes this about weeds and wheat. 'The slaves said to the farmer, "Then do you want us to go and root up the weeds?" But he replied, "No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them." Matthew 13.28–29 - The Parable of the Weeds.'

The message is that good and bad are inextricably jumbled together in this world. You can't root out all the evil without risking destroying the good at the same time. In fact you cannot divide good people from bad people. We are all works in progress. So we should each recognize our imperfections, and resolve to improve as quickly as we can.

It is disappointing that the people who claim to follow Jesus are not yet how he wants them to be, but Jesus is working on us. A teacher in the Middle Ages called Meister Eckhart said, 'Grace is never a stationary thing, it is always found in a becoming.' In other words, God's love is not seen in a church full of perfect goody-goodies – God's love shines out from a church made up of forgiven sinners, whom God is trying to turn into better people. In fact, it's a good thing the Church is made up of sinners, otherwise there would be nowhere for me and you to find a home!

It is inevitable that the weeds and flowers will grow side by side until the harvest time. What everyone must do, then, is accept that we ourselves are as weedy as the people we may criticize, then beg God for his forgiveness, and work hard on our selfish faults, so that we shall become slightly better by the time our Father gathers us into his heavenly flower vases.

Born in Howsham, 12 miles north east of York, in 1800, on leaving school he was apprenticed to a firm of Drapers in York, and married the daughter of one of the partners in 1821. Chris told us all about the 'ups and downs' of the life of George Hudson, the man York has to thank for the prominent role in the railways. He involved his audience throughout his talk and we listened with such interest, that afterwards one member said she wished he had been her history teacher. Those of you who are not familiar with George Hudson, who was Lord Mayor of York 1837-8, his life makes fascinating telling. He died in London in 1871 and fittingly his coffin came back to York by train.



Deliveries will be made as soon as Tate Fuels have enough orders for a full tanker load to this area, with a guaranteed maximum wait of one month. In practice it will be very much shorter.
